

RSE Coverage Map

- ✓ Cyclical: Pupils revisit the five key areas throughout KS1 and KS2.
- ✓ Increasing depth: Each time a key area is revisited, it is covered with greater depth and increasing maturity.
- ✓ Prior knowledge: Upon returning to each key area, prior knowledge is utilised so pupils can build on previous foundations.

The RSE curriculum is taught within the PSHCE Curriculum and will appear throughout the year within some sessions.

Each year we will have a designated week where the RSE curriculum will be taught by staff.

We will use the Kapow Lessons Plans, Big Talk Resources.

During this week the children will need to be taught in their separate year groups.

There is no need to separate boys and girls for these sessions.
